#### Board and Executive Meeting in Munich

He was granted Emeritus status in 1984.

May our dear colleague rest in peace after a successful life devoted to our good cause.

But life goes on and so does our work, carried on by new members. It is my pleasure to announce the election of two new members, who will help us fulfill the expectations the industrial world has regarding IAQ.

#### Dr. Kenneth E. Case

Born 1944, Dr. Case obtained his PhD in Industrial Engineering from the Oklahoma State University in 1969. Before that he had worked in industry as an engineer. From 1969 to 1974 he was first Assistant Professor, then Associate Professor at the Virginia Polytechnic Institute, teaching courses in Industrial Engineering and QC. # European Quality Management Forum, Montreux

The following was received from Acn <u>Seghezzi</u>:

The European Foundation for Quality Management (EFQM) which was founded in Brussels in September 1989 by the presidents of 14 leading European companies, invited its 67 Founding and Key Members for its first Forum held in Montreux, Switzerland, on 19th October 1989. The President of the European Organization for Quality (EOQC), Mr. J. A. Goldsmith, emphasized the synergy which should arise out of the agreed close cooperation of the both European organizations. Academician H.Dieter Seghezzi who was Chairman of Montreux Programme Committee, is the official delegate of EOQC in the EFQM Executive Committee and the liaison person between both organizations.

Many fruitful thoughts were exchanged in Montreux. This event will certainly promote the idea of quality in Europe.

# "Profiles in Excellence"

With considerable interest did I read the excellent brochure "Profiles in Excellence", issued by the American Productivity and Quality Center. It chronicles the Malcolm Baldrige Award's first year of existence and gives guidance regarding the Award process. I want to thank Acn Wachniak, himself deeply and actively involved as judge, for making the text available to me.

# IAQ Hungarian Project carried on

I was pleased to read the following from Acn <u>Aschner</u> upon my return from a most enjoyable stay in a beautiful castle-turned-lecturing-venue in the Hungarian countryside:

"In the framework of the IAQ project in Hungary Professor Masing held a two-day-long seminar for the top managers of two Hungarian companies, Tungsram Co. and Taurus on December 14 and 15, 1989. If we report on "lending a hand", the endeavours of Acn <u>Aschner</u> and our late colleague, Acn <u>Freund</u> (cf CONTACT 34/36/37) must be recalled in Hungary.

#### Latin America

Besides honorary positions in other scientific organizations, Acn Goldsmith served for EOQ first as Chairman of the Pharma and Cosmetics section, then as Vice-President for Committees and Sections and finally as President for the therm 1988-1990. He is Visiting Professor of Strathclyde University. He has authored numerous papers in scientific periodicals and appeared as lecturer on many national and internat'l conferences.

This may create the impression that its content is only temporary in nature. We know, of course, that this is not so. Please emphazise that fact! The Academy needs this outlet.

# 8th Triennial Meeting in San Francisco

The turnout was impressive already on Sunday, May 13, at the informal outing with the ladies. From there, an ancient train, complete with uniformed engineer and conductor brought us farther south to Roaring Camp, where a barbecue luncheon was served, topped off with marshmellows for dessert. For quite a few of us (e.g.this reporter) it was the first time in their lives to savour this delicacy, personally roasted (fingers included) over an open fire. A stroll through the adjacent parc with its magnificent redwoods - some more than 1000 years old - provided the necessary physical exercise before the bus took us back to San Francisco via the famous coast route.

A cordial "Thank you!" is due to the able organizers, Marguerite and Jim Harrington, who had even seen to it that the weather was just perfect.

Even more Academicians assembled on Wednesday, May 16, in the afternoon for the official meeting in the Walnut Room of the San Francisco Hilton hotel. You will get the minutes by separate mail. Here I'll say only that 6 new Academicians got their diplomas and lapel pins from Chairman Feigenbaum and president Zeller: Acns Bester, Chauvel, Godfrey, Hromi and Seitschek. Later on, they gave their introductory papers, after the business part of the meeting.

This was introduced by Acn <u>Bertin</u>, speaker of the Nominations Committee. He gave the statistics of our membership: 55 active, 4 corresponding, 2 honorary. With a target of 75, the Academy has still room for new truly active members. Nominations are welcome.

President Zeller stated in his report that the new constitution, put to ballot by the whole Academy, had been approved overwhelmingly: only one return had recommended some additional changes. Acn Zeller went on to explain the legal facts of IAQ now a "registered, tax-free body under German law". Up to now, the members of the Board and the Executive, supported by Acn Hansen, had represented IAQ in a proxy-capacity. The Assembly voted unanimously that all members be incorporated in that scheme. A short financial report was added and members exhorted to pay their dues when billed without the added cost connected with up to 3 (!) reminders.

Vice-president Harrington outlined the status of IAQ project work. The project leaders present gave additional informations. At the end of this agenda item, a video was shown: Quality Management in Small and Medium Size Firms, made under the guidance of Acn Harrington by a professional film crew. The video begins and ends with the IAQ logo, and in it, both, Acn Feigenbaum and the author give some information on IAQ and its goals. The video was received with applause.

The next meeting will be held in Dublin/Ireland on September 19, 1990. An invitation by president <u>Zeller</u> is printed herewith. At this occasion, the Officers and Board Members for the term 1991-1993 will be announced and elected. The next Triennial Meeting is scheduled in Europe, the exact venue to be announced at a later date.

#### Acn Burgess active as ever before

In his letter of June 14, Acn <u>Burgess</u> informs me about an invitation he got from the American Bureau of Shipping to present a 2-day seminar for their staff and customers on the subject of ISO 9000 and the European Market. He goes on to say: "It was clear from the ASQC conference that this subject is of major concern in the USA as 1992 gets closer."

As I have a few lines to spare, I copy from his letter the following:

Quite separately, as an active member from the UK working in the European organisation for quality, I was asked to chair the EOQ Section set up at Vienna in September 1989 concerned with consultancy. The section has met twice and meets again in Dublin. The first task is to work with the EFQM in developing a register of European Quality Management Consultants. I also chair the joint Steering Group which is making good progress, hopefully in time for launch of the register later in 1990 or early 1991.

#### Re-thinking Quality Cost

IAQ is expected to come up with fresh ideas and new thoughts. By living up to these expectations, we should never be afraid to challenge conventional wisdom, time-honoured teachings and/or the content of standards. IAQ exists to push the frontiers of the Quality science farther out. It is our raison d'être. We should not default on this.

At the same time, IAQ must be careful not to destroy the well-established basis of quality management and -techniques. To define what is still useful and what needs to be redesigned is a delicate task.

A case in point is the Quality Cost concept.

IAQ has undertaken to start a project named "Re-thinking Quality Cost". I have been called upon to be the director of that project. As this theme is presently in the very center of my interests, I took the challenge.

In the very near future, I will call on a selected number of IAQ members to help me, because I want to put it on as broad a base as I ever can. I do hope that those whom I ask directly, won't let me down. But if anyone is interested to be part of this venture, please let me know.
