this time I have to start with an apology: My report on IAQ activities in Prague in connection with the EOQ congress there was incomplete. Two, even three important events were missing. Here they are.

Acn Zaludova had arranged a visit with the cabinet minister of federal control, Dr. Korînkova, by chairman Feigenbaum, president Harrington and Acns Hurd and Masing. She had opened the congress with an address to the delegates, frankly explaining the enormous problems the country has in transition from a centrally planned to a market economy. She expressed her opinion, however, that these problems will eventually be solved basing her optimism on the industrial past of the country, known for high quality products. The visitors underlined their willingness to be of assistance, whenever possible and useful. Options in this context were discussed.

This high-level meeting was a follow-up of a government level quality awareness workshop, well organized on June 18, 1991, by Acn Zaludova. Speakers were Acns Harrington, Hurd, and Masing. Their papers were well received.

Nana had taken further advantage of the presence of so many Academicians in Prague. She and Acns  $\underline{\text{Burgess}}$  and  $\underline{\text{Hromi}}$  even had to miss the IAQ meeting only because they took part in a function of the Czechoslovak Society for Quality, where they presented market-oriented quality ideas.

# Academicians busy in Eastern Europe

The CSFR is not the only country in eastern Europe experiencing great problems. Atn <u>Burgess</u> was in Warsaw on a EEC mission with the Danish Technological Institute to help improve quality management in Poland. Seminars with various topics were presented at the Warsaw Technical University and the Quality Research Institute. A party of 15 experts were invited to visit the UK later this year to help them understand western quality activities.

Having spent a good part of his boyhood in Estonia (and still having a working knowledge of Estonian) it was only natural for Acn <u>Masing</u> to follow invitations of the Estonian Management Institute in Tallinn and the University of Tartu to hold seminars there already in the past years. As a follow-up of these seminars, last year an Estonian Society for Quality was founded.

This years seminar coincided with the historical days in August, when Estonia regained the independence from the Sowiet Union. In view of that incredible evolution, the seminar leader stopped proceedings every half hour to give the participants the chance to switch on their radios and listen to the latest developments.

There are unforgettable seminars among the mass of others. During a seminar in a hotel not more than a stone-throw from the Iron Fence that devided my country for almost 40 years, I was eyewitness of the demolition of this infernal structure. And now this seminar in Tallinn! Forgive me for having almost become emotional. There are events that overrun the routine of editing a newsletter...

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# Brazil interested in European Quality Matters

A series of 9 conferences and seminars given by Acn <u>Chauvel</u> in a number of Brazilian cities dealt (among others) with quality evolution and certification in Europe and consumerism and quality in Europe. #### Third party certification

I therefore question if one of you would volunteer as project leader for a project trying to investigate the opinion of a sample of big European companies on the question: To what extent will the companies really rely on a third party certificate when discussing a possible delivery from a new supplier? Any volunteers as project leader or members of a project team should contact me.

## A sabbatical year for Acn Aune

Academician Asbjørn Aune is doing his final planning for his sabbatical year 1991/92 which he will spend in the US. Most likely he will work at Babson College - A Business/ Management College - outside Boston during the fall of When in Boston he will be in touch with a 1.5 year old Center for Quality Management and with people at MIT. The spring semester he plans to stay at Virginia Politechnic Institute and State University in Blacksburg, Virginia where he was a visiting professor in 1984/85.
