

Chair's Message to the Academy



As I conclude my term as Chair of the Academy and reflect on the past 6 years of my responsebility first as President and then as Chair it gives me great sense of satisfaction and pride to have the opportunity to serve

such a prestigious organization. This is an honour I never sought and I believe there were many more eminent academicians who were better qualified. However, I accepted the role at the persuasion of Academicians Noriaki Kano and Gregory Watson who were instrumental in inducting me into the Academy in 2008. Being new to the Academy at the time of becoming the President and not knowing many Academicians Greg was kind enough to select the executives and the trustees for the triennial. That was an excellent team and I enjoyed working with them.

My task became easy as Greg, his team and other predecessors had established a sound midterm vision for the Academy and restructured the bylaws and operating systems. Greg resigned as Chair due to Health reasons in May 2012 and Sr. Mary Jean was elected as Chair for the rest of the term. It was a privilege to work with Sr. Mary Jean as she was an excellent guide with clear vision and direction. She helped me through various difficult situations. She led us to create the IAQ way – Quality for Humanity, a new vision and values for the Academy.

Rest of the 5 years my focus was to work towards that vision and ensuring we make progress towards our goal following the strategy we inherited. While doing so our endeavour was to comply with the Bylaws in word and in spirit as the primary responsibility of the Executive and the Trustees.

In this process I recognise some members might have felt uncomfortable and hurt. I offer them my unconditional apologies as that was not our intent.

During this period the Academy wiped out a debt of US\$ 28,000 and created a positive balance of around US\$ 40,000 by end December 2017. Enhanced attendance of the Academicians through value adding activities during the meetings learning from each other and from others. More active participation of the new Academicians through timely introductory speeches attendance. Induction of Dr. Shoichiro Toyoda Honorary Chairman of Toyota Motor Corporation as the first Councillor of the Academy. Induction of many eminent members particularly top business executives as Academicians. Correcting some historical anomalies and honouring members who established the Academy. First lady as the Chair of the Academy and then electing first lady as the incoming President. Organization of two "IAQ World Quality Forums" in 2015 and 2017. I would like to make special mention of exceptional work done by Academician Glenn Mazur as Secretary and Treasurer for sound financial health of the Academy and for excellent coordination with the members creating up to date information. Special mention of Academician Lars Sorqvist, Chair Examining Committee for his fair, transparent and firm management of the examination process without fear or favour. He and his team has done an outstanding job in the induction process of new members and change of status of members.

Compliments to President Pal Molnar for his leadership and unique contribution over the current triennial in organizing two World Quality Forums. Incoming President Elizabeth Keim made has been of immense help in redrafting Bylaws over the last three triennials.

I admire honorary member Marcos Bertin for his untiring effort in Chairing the Governance Think Tank and for recognising world class leaders with the BQiG Medal every year. At this age he is more active than most members thereby acting as a good role model. Marcos guided me during many difficult situations through his timely and sound advice. I admire Greg Watson for his energy and enthusiasm for the cause of quality inspite of many health issues. Above all I admire Noriaki Kano for his constant support, in the background, for my various efforts and guidance through difficult periods. His contribution to the theory and knowledge of quality and his unobtrusive ways to support others has helped many quality societies to flourish in different parts of the world in alignment with the vision of the Academy. I recognize his unparalleled contribution to the cause of the Academy.

I thank Michael Sullivan for his untiring effort and contribution to the affairs of the Academy in his quite ways following the IAQ Way.

I take this opportunity to wish all members 'compliments of the season and a very happy New Year with good health and cheer.'

The 1st World Quality Forum (WQF) of the International Academy for Quality which was held in Budapest on October 26-27, 2015 could contribute very well to the "Corporate Identity" of IAQ. The 1st WQF of IAQ could deliver a product that is worthy

and has enduring value to the global quality community also for the coming IAQ Forums which are planned for every two years.

In 2017 the 61th EOQ Congress "Success in the Digital Era - Quality as a Key Driver" was a joint effort of European Organization for Quality (EOQ) and the Slovenian Quality and Excellence Association as well as International Academy for Quality (IAQ) which was held in Bled, Slovenia on



Honorary Member C. Jackson Grayson (1924-2017)

Dr. C. Jackson "Jack"
Grayson, who rose to
national prominence
when he served as
chairman of the U.S.
Price Commission under
President Richard M.
Nixon before later
founding the American
Productivity & Quality



Center (APQC, www.apqc.org), passed away peacefully on Thursday, May 4, 2017, at his home in Houston, Texas. He was 93.

Grayson spent his entire professional career applying quality thinking and methods to help improve organizations and society. Beyond APQC, he was lauded for his work as a creator of the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award; chairman of U.S. Price Commission; cofounder of the Houstonian Hotel, Club & Spa; and dean for business schools at both Tulane and Southern Methodist University.

Though the price controls instituted in the early 1970s were widely unpopular, Grayson earned national recognition from the press, business leaders, and labor for his transparent and fair administration and later for his work to remove the controls. During this period Grayson came to understand that productivity growth in America was falling and sounded the alarm about the nation's sagging productivity, quality, and competitiveness.


